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Professor Eisenberg regularly provides professional trainings and workshops on negotiation, mediation, mediation ethics, and other conflict resolution topics. She is a certified trainer in restorative practices from the International Institute for Restorative Practices. She serves as a mediator in civil and employment cases and is a member of the Advisory Board of the Maryland Judiciary's Mediation and Conflict Resolution Office and the Maryland Program for Mediator Excellence.

Prior to academia, Professor Eisenberg practiced law for more than fifteen years, litigating many landmark cases in federal and state courts in Maryland and throughout the United States, as well as representing clients in arbitration and mediation. Her diverse practice included work at a large commercial law firm, a public interest advocacy organization, and a boutique litigation firm where she focused on employment law and complex civil rights litigation.

Professor Eisenberg received her J.D. from Yale Law School in 1994, where she was a symposium editor of the *Yale Law Journal*. She graduated Valedictorian of her class at the University of Maryland Baltimore County in 1991, with a B.A. in Political Science.
